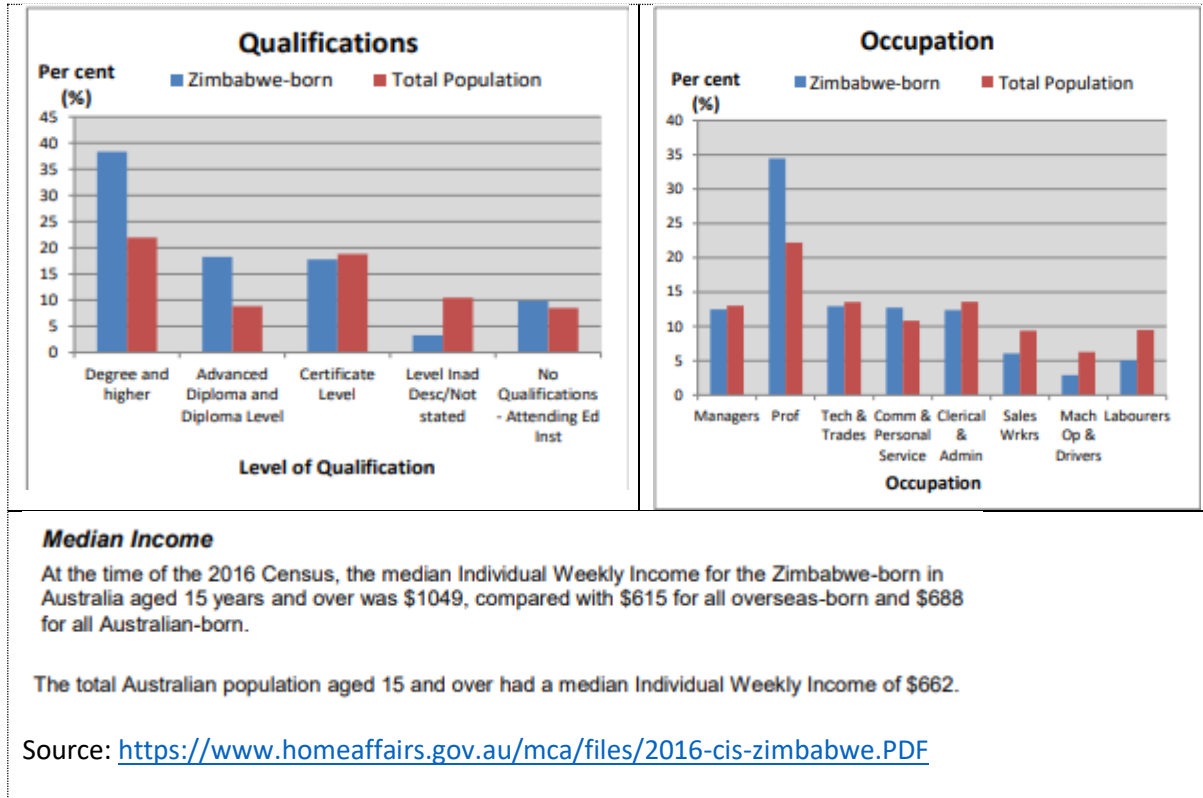


Why a Mutual Aid Society
